Q&A on Spring Knolls' 2025 invoice pay option: Zelle

Association OKs online dues payments with banking / app option. Here's how you can join.

Spring Knolls Association Treasurer Sharon Kilpatrick and bookkeeper Kim Eaton prepared the following summary and tips on how residents may sign up for Zelle, the Spring Knolls boardapproved invoice payment option.

Q 1. Briefly, what is Zelle?

A. Zelle is a fast, easy way to send and receive money between bank accounts.

Q 2. Why is Spring Knolls Association going to use it?

A. The Association decided to use Zelle to accommodate members who want to make payments electronically.

Q 3. Can I just keep paying my dues the way I always have?

A. Yes. Zelle is not required. You can continue with your current payment method or return to it if you decide you no longer want to use Zelle. Spring Knolls Association accepts payments by paper checks, money orders, cashier's checks or Zelle.

Q 4. I'm worried about privacy. Is this a safe process?

A. Yes. Using Zelle is safe. Please practice your own online safety; do not send money to anyone you do not know; please always review your intended recipient's information and amount you are sending.

Q 5. How do I sign up for Zelle?

A. To use Zelle you need to be able to do your banking online or through your bank's mobile app. If you already do either, you can log into your bank account online or check in your banking app to see if your bank offers Zelle. If it does, you'll need to enroll in Zelle. Here's how.

Log into your online bank account or mobile banking app

- 1. Select Pay and Transfer
- 2. Select Send Money with Zelle
- 3. Choose Get Started
- 4. Choose your **Primary Bank Account** (if you have more than one) to use for Zelle
- 5.Add your Zelle contact info (Email Address and/or mobile number)
- 6.Once you add your Zelle contact infor-



mation you'll be asked to add a verification code sent to your email or mobile number. Once you enter your verification code you're enrolled to use Zelle

- 7. Next, you need to add a new recipient
- 8. Choose **Send** or request money
- 9. Select add new recipient

10. Please use the following email address and recipient name when adding set up information.

Name: Spring Knolls Association Email: springknolls1@verizon.net

Then choose **SAVE**. The Association is now one of your recipients

Return to your **Pay & Transfer** Select Send money with Zelle

Choose Spring Knolls Association from your list of recipients

Enter the amount you want to send, the account to send the money from and what day to send the money.

Tap "Review & Send" – First, please make sure the amount you wish to send is correct, Review your request and "tap" "Send it now" to send the money.

<u>SPECIAL NOTE</u>: In step 10 under PAY & TRANSFER we suggest that you only send <u>\$1</u> until you can confirm to yourself that you've entered the <u>correct email address</u> for the recipient and that you get your email back from your bank stating so.

Q 6. What if I already use Zelle for other payments?

A. If you already use Zelle, you don't need to tell the Association that you'll be

paying via Zelle. We receive emails stating who sent the funds and the amount of the funds sent.

Q 7. Once I enroll in Zelle, is there a waiting period?

A. In most cases there's no waiting period. The only restriction may be how much you can send, especially to new recipients.

Q 8. Will Zelle cost me anything?

A. Most banks charge nothing, but you should check with yours.

Q 9. I expect my invoice in the mail because I'm not signed up to receive them through email. Can I still use Zelle or do I have to opt for emailed invoices?

A. You can still use Zelle regardless of how you receive your invoice.

Q 10. How will the association know that I made my payment through Zelle?

A. The Association will receive an email from its bank that states a Zelle payment has been received from you, the amount you paid and when you sent the payment.

Q 11. Will I know you got a Zelle payment?

A. Yes. Your bank will notify you that you sent a payment to the Association. You'll also see the payment in your bank account online register.

Q 12. Can I start this right away?

A. Yes. Spring Knolls Association's bank is ready to receive your Zelle payment.

Q. 13 Where can I learn more? Zelle?

A. Through your bank or from Zelle's website. https://www.zellepay.com.

SCAM ALERT: I.D. photos, badges are bogus

Federal law enforcement agencies are warning the public to be skeptical of emails and text messages claiming to be from a government or law enforcement agency.

To gain trust, scammers are emailing or texting pictures of real or doctored credentials or badges in an attempt to prove their legitimacy. They may change the photo or use a



different name, agency or badge number, but it is still a scam.

No one in federal law enforcement will

send photos of credentials or badges to demand any payment and neither will government employees.

Your mailbox will soon have more than holiday cards

Dues invoice, election info among items you'll receive

If you haven't already received some seasonal mailings from the Spring Knolls Association, fear not, they'll be there soon.

These include your dues invoice showing that for 2025 your annual payments will be \$984, which can be paid in a lump sum, in two semiannual payments or a month at a time. Your invoice will tell you your options.

With your invoice you'll also receive your Owner-Resident form. It's on green paper, and asks for updated information about your homes. This is a state-required form to ensure we remain a 55-plus community and must be filled out even if none of the information changed.

Also, you'll be receiving reports about our clubhouse needs, our insurance, our annual policy statement and an independent study of our reserve fund.

Finally, you'll receive information including a ballot about our 2025 board of directors election.

SKERT Diary: Members jump in to help events

Senior Resource, Wildfire fairs, smoke detectors among efforts involving SKERT members

January 2024: We're involved in the planning of Spring Knolls first Senior Resource Fair, rather than an Open House, set for April 6. This event, organized by Senior Advocate Holli Hanson and Lori Miller, will have various exhibitors displaying their services for all three Knolls units...

... We learned that **Gerald Winkel** and Red Cross volunteers will be installing free smoke detectors throughout the Knolls in March.

February: Area Coordinator Steve Lopez moved from Spring Knolls, but he brought a new area coordinator, Darlene Lovell.



March: On March 9, Red Cross volunteers, including some SKERT members, install 251 smoke detectors for 168 Knolls residents (33% more than anticipated) and eight bed shakers...

... Holli reported that 16 exhibitors will be participating in the April 6 Senior Resource Fair.

April: We had 109 attendees for the April 6 Senior Resource Fair. There were 41 from Spring Knolls, 13 from



Warm Spring Knolls, and 53 from Golf Knolls. Thanks to Holli and Lori, as well as other SKERT members, the Boosters and Lisa McKinney for their work on this event.

May: The Senior Resource Fair is the event which keeps on giving!

Presenter Avon Hall is holding monthly classes on computers and cell phones, Habitat for Humanity is scheduling Spring Knolls homes for low-cost repainting and other homes for yard clean ups. Also, Red Cross volunteers continue to install smoke detectors, and Firewise scheduled a survey on our association...

SKERT is planning a Wildfire Fair, rather than a ShakeOut event, for October.

June: We discussed the July 4 golf cart parade / car show (with the Drifters car club). Veteran Raphael Cervantes will be Grand Marshal.

July: Murrieta Police officer Michael Byrne came to the July 10 SKERT meeting to talk to us about the YANA (You Are Not Alone) program. Volunteers call residents to see if they're doing okay. If no one answers, they will send a police officer to check up on them.

YANA is used by many California

police and sheriff's departments and is now rolling out in Murrieta.

August: Firewise, CalFire and the City of Murrieta came out for a walk -through of the Firewise program. We looked at how we could "harden" our homes and what defensible space requirements mean, we will submit an application to become a Firewise community.


September: Retired Fire Captain and Spring Knolls resident Ed Carey and I completed 76 surveys on homes in SK. We did a random inspection of various homes and tallied the results, which will be included in our application for a Firewise designation. This month Lori Miller's home became the first in Spring Knolls to be painted through Habitat's Brush with Kindness program. Good news, Habitat can work on homes of renters if the landlord agrees.

October: The Oct. 5 Wildfire Fair was a great success, with representatives from CalFire, the City of Murrieta Fire Dept., Firewise, and Red Cross in a panel discussion.

The panelists provided information on: the new Fire Reduction listing for Murrieta, which may reduce insurance costs for some homeowners; the new Genasys alert system for wildfires; a grant the city received to clear out the gully off of Via La Colina, etc.

November: The Firewise submittal is still pending. Architectural Director and Area Coordinator Jan Towers is passing out Firewise literature to residents redoing their landscaping or installing a new unit. Another resident is having their house painted through Habitat. Another is getting theirs done in a few months.

How you can help protect your home, neighbors from wildfire destruction

There's been a lot of news regarding Wildfires. As you may know, our community has applied for the Firewise program, and awaiting approval.

In the meantime, I'd like to share with you some helpful recommendations from firefighting experts to help homeowners improve how their home and neighborhood can surive a wildfire.

Here's a checklist of steps that help reduce the risk of your home and property becoming fuel for a wildfire.

- 1. Clear ignitable materials such as needles and leaves from your roof, gutters, eaves, porches and decks.
- 2. **Repair** any loose or missing roof shingles / tiles, and caulk any gaps or openings on roof edges.
- 3. **Cover** exterior attic vents and install metal wire mesh (1/8 inch or smaller)

to under-eave and soffit vents.

- 4. **Relocate** items kept under decks or porches; swap out vegetation in these areas for rock or gravel.
- 5. **Replace** mulch with hardscaping, including rock, gravel or stone.
- 6. Remove ignitable features within 30 feet of all structures including firewood piles, portable propane tanks and dry and dead vegetation.
- 7. **Protect** water any dry grass and shrubs, trim brown vegetation and dispose of yard waste.
- 8. **Prune** low hanging branches (6-10 feet for taller trees, 1/3 of tree height for smaller trees); remove any tall grasses, vines and shrubs from under trees.
- 9. **Contact** neighbors and create a plan to address shared wildfire safety concerns together.

Hope that this is helpful information for our community!
