Here's a friendly reminder to all Spring Knolls owners regarding your 2024 second half assessments (dues):

Everyone should know by now that trash pickup, as of March 2024, is direct billed to you through Waste Management and no longer paid through your Spring Knolls assessments.

Here's some Good News: As promised, you will receive a one-time \$130 credit applied to your 2024 assessments for the adjustment of the direct bill through Waste Management.

Please remember that the \$130 amount constitutes the \$13-a-month for March through December 2024 (\$13 x 10 months) that was billed to you in your 2024 assessments. At the time, it was

uncertain exactly when Waste Management would take over.

How the credit/reimbursements work:

1. If you paid your 2024 assessments in full at the beginning of the year, you will receive a \$130 refund check in the mail along with your 2024 assessment invoice stamped "Paid in Full."
2. If you paid half (\$540) of your 2024 assessments at the beginning of the year, your second half assessments will be credited \$130, and your balance owed will be \$410 (2nd half \$540 minus the \$130 credit) and you will receive an updated invoice reflecting the amount payable by July 1.

Your updated invoice is being mailed May 31 through June 5. If you have not received it by June 13, please call me at **951 285-7800** or drop by the office on Friday June 14, between 9:30 a.m. and noon.

Remember that your dues should be paid by **July 1** and will be considered late after **July 15**.

The library is open during the summer from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. and our loans are on the honor system. Library rules, procedures, tips are on the back of bookmarks.

DMV OPENS 'EXPRESS' OFFICE: The Department of Motor Vehicles has opened what it calls an "Express Office" in Murrieta to handle certain services. It includes the following services:

Original and replacement ID cards; Driver's license replacement with changes (address and name); Driver's written exam retests; commercial driver's license medical updates/submissions; duplicate vehicle titles; commercial motor vehicle partial year registration; disabled person parking placards.

Note: Applying for original driver's licenses and behind-the-wheel driving tests still must be completed at a full-service field office.

This Express office at 27890 Clinton Keith Road accepts only credit and debit cards for payments and is walk-in only (no appointments.) Hours: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Wednesday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

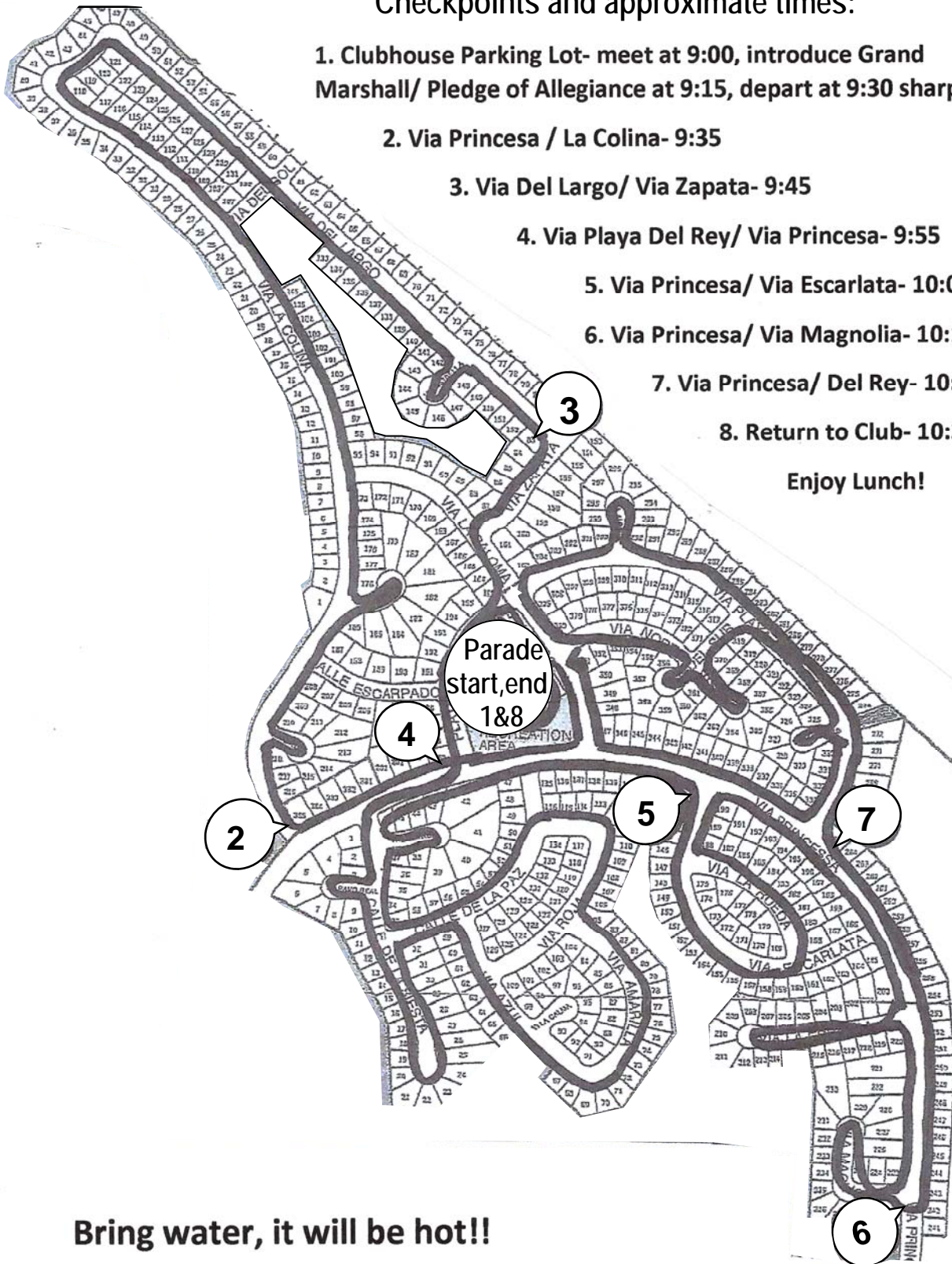

Following is a brief update on some Senior Resource Fair presenters and their future work with Spring Knolls:

- **Avon Hall** will be in the Spring Knolls Library at 2 p.m., Wednesday June 5, for another IT/computer class. He will start with a brief overview and then take your questions if you're having issues with your computer, laptop or cell phone.
 - **National Fire Protection Association (NFPA)** representatives will review our association for recognition as a "Firewise USA" community. NFPA representatives were at the Senior Resource Fair, and have offered to share their knowledge to help reduce wildfire risks in the Knolls. The association is a self-funded non-profit. See NFPA - Firewise USA®
 - **Synergy** has been servicing homes for residents, with some work being done for free (depending on your income). Call 888 988-0445 for details, or see No Cost Programs (synergycompanies.com)
 - We are looking to set up a **YANA (You Are Not Alone)** program in SKA similar to one established by the Murrieta Police Department. YANA volunteers would make wellness phone calls to people having difficulty leaving their homes. Please let us know if you'd like to volunteer. More info to follow!
 - **Habitat for Humanity** will be setting up a day to clear weeds from your properties (most likely in July). In addition, Habitat volunteers will be taking applications for their "Brush With Kindness" program, in which they paint homes and do minor repairs. Call Habitat's **Linda Thomas** at 951 261-5955 for more information.
- **Alan Hanson** is chair of the Spring Knolls Emergency Response Team (SKERT). **Holli Hanson** is Association Secretary and Senior Advocate.

Spring Knolls Pool Rules



Warning: No lifeguard on duty

Swim at your own risk.

In case of emergency, call 911

(Emergency phone is next to outside Library doors.)

- Spring Knolls owners/residents with a gate fob must be with guests at all times (*limit of 4 guests*) while in pool areas.
- Owners/residents are responsible for guests' behavior.
- Adults must be with children at all times: (1 for every 3 children).
- Pool capacities. **Adult pool: 50** (18 or older) / **Small pool: 30**.
- **No** running in pool areas.
- **No** loud games or excessive splashing at either pool.
- **No** diving, jumping, 'bombing,' or pushing people into pools.
- **No** bikes or pets in pool areas. Guide / service dogs permitted.
- **No** food allowed except at designated patio tables.
- **No** glass containers or dishes in pool areas. Non alcoholic drinks in plastic containers are allowed.
- **No** float devices permitted except 'noodles' and child 'floaties'.
- **No** wet bathing suits permitted in carpeted clubhouse areas.
Children under 3 must wear leak-proof diapers / pants.
- **No** pool use by anyone with active diarrhea in past 14 days.
- Restrooms/showers by caretaker's residence. Please use them.
- **The Jacuzzi is available only to those 18+.**

Pool rules include those of California Health Department and Spring Knolls Association.

Violators subject to fines, and/or suspension of pool privileges.
